ITINERARY

September 27th Friday - DULLES, USA TO DUBLIN, IRELAND

Depart Dulles on Aer Lingus flight 118 to Dublin at 5:15pm. Enjoy in-flight entertainment and meal service on your overnight flight. Caddie Tours will be happy to organize flights from any US city to Dublin.

September 28th Saturday - DUBLIN ARRIVAL

After landing at Dublin Airport, complete customs and immigration formalities. Your Caddie Tours driver/guide will welcome you to Ireland and escort you and your luggage to the coach. Check into your hotel and join your fellow travelers for breakfast. There's no better way to explore Dublin city than on the Hop on Hop off double-decker tour bus (included). Most visitors to Dublin want to visit attractions like the Guinness Storehouse, Trinity College and the Book of Kells, Kilmainham Gaol, and The Wax Museum, but Niall recommends you see some of the city's hidden gems like the Little Museum of Dublin, EPIC The Irish Emigration Museum (A must see if you have Irish roots!), The Irish Rock and Roll Museum Experience, Marsh's Library beside St. Patrick's Cathedral, and many more.

September 29th Sunday - HUGH LANE GALLERY & SLIGO

After breakfast drive to the Hugh Lane Gallery on Parnell Square for Midday concert by the Pressenda Chamber Players. Dublin City Gallery The Hugh Lane has an exceptional history centred around the ground-breaking vision of Sir Hugh Lane himself. Hugh Lane held the first exhibition of Irish Art in 1904 in London and continued to innovate by endowing the Gallery with a unique and exceptional collection of modern art, including the first impressionist paintings in any public collection across Britain and Ireland. Sir Hugh Lane presented the collection to Dublin Corporation (now Dublin City Council) in 1908. Depart Dublin driving through the Midlands of Ireland before reaching Markree Castle in Sligo for our 2 night stay. Join your fellow travelers for dinner tonight in the castle.

September 30th Monday - PARKES CASTLE & LOUGH GILL CRUISE After breakfast we head for 400 year old Parkes Castle that once was an

important stronghold of the local O'Rourke family where we take a boat cruise on beautiful Lough Gill. We'll sail around the Isle of Inishfree made famous by noted poet, William Butler Yeats. We'll view serene and tranguil waters against a backdrop of the sweeping Benbulben Mountain and the gorgeous scenery of County Sligo. Return to the castle for dinner and concert by the Pressenda Chamber Players.

October 1st Tuesday - MUSEUM OF COUNTRY LIFE & CLIFDEN

After breakfast depart for Castlebar to visit the Museum of Country Life which features exhibits of domestic goods in daily use during the 19th & 20th centuries. Have some lunch in the cafe before we continue onto Clifden for out two night stay. Join your fellow travelers for dinner tonight in the hotel.

The cafe situated in the centre of the store serves delicious home baked food. Situated in 'An Spidéal' or Spiddal, the gateway to Connemara, the store is located on the Wild Atlantic Way, just 14 km from Galway City. The store has received an array of awards and

October 5. Saturday - FREE DAY IN GALWAY

Artsy, bohemian Galway is one of Ireland's most engaging cities. Brightly painted pubs heave with live music, while restaurants and cafes offer front-row seats for observing buskers and street theatre. Remnants of the medieval town walls lie between shops selling handcrafted Claddagh rings, books and musical instruments. Bridges arch over the salmon-stuffed River Corrib; and a long promenade leads to the seaside suburb of Salthill on Galway Bay, the source of the area's famous oysters. Today, Galway is one of the most popular tourist destinations in Ireland and designated European City of Culture in 2020. It is a vibrant, thriving city, rich in artistic and musical culture. The old city of Galway comprises less than 50 acres and is perfect for exploring on foot. **We offer a**
